# HC grants bail to Dawood ‘aide’, cites long stay in jail

The Bombay High Court (HC) has granted bail to Tariq Parveen, an alleged close aide of Dawood Ibrahim, in a 2020 extortion case, taking into account his prolonged incarceration of over five years and the possibility of trial getting concluded soon.

On May 8, Justice Milind Jadhav said Parveen has been in jail for five years and there is no possibility of the trial concluding in the near future. “Detaining an undertrial prisoner for such an extended period further violates his fundamental right to speedy trial flowing from Article 21 of the Constitution,” the court said. The bench added that such a long period of detention only serves to legitimise the award of ‘surrogate punishment’ to that person, which amounts to pre-trial punishment, HC said.

Parveen was arrested on February 9, 2020, under the provisions of stringent Maharashtra Control of Organised Crime Act



(MCOCA) and the Indian Penal Code in connection with an extortion case. After his bail was rejected by the special MCOCA court, he approached the HC through Advocate Ravi Dwivedi. He sought bail on the grounds of long incarceration and non-completion of trial in the foreseeable future.

State Advocate Mahalakshmi Ganapathy argued that Parveen was the main accused and part of an organised crime syndicate. She expressed concern that “if bail is granted, there is every possibility of the applicant re-

offending, tampering with evidence and influencing witnesses”. She also cited his “past criminal antecedents and the serious nature of the charges”.

However, the HC found the long pre-trial detention untenable. “It is one of the principle rules of criminal jurisprudence that an accused is innocent until proven guilty. This rule cannot be taken lightly, especially when liberty of an undertrial person has been at stake for over five years,” Justice Jadhav said.

Parveen’s complicity in the crime can certainly be proved at the trial after adequate

evaluation of evidence and if found guilty then he will face the appropriate punishment, the court added. “At this prima facie stage, I am inclined to consider the bail application solely due to the applicant’s long incarceration pending trial,” Justice Jadhav said.

After furnishing a surety of Rs25,000, Parveen was released from the Talaja prison on Wednesday.

## Sentencing in Adv Jaiswal murder today

A decade after the sensational murder of Advocate Meenakshi Jaiswal in Kharghar, the Panvel sessions court is set to pronounce the sentence for the convicted trio today (May 15). The local citizens as well as the legal fraternity are closely watching the case outcome.

Jaiswal, former chairperson of the State Commission for Protection of Child Rights, lived in Vastu Vihar Celebration building in Kharghar. Her husband, Dr Santosh Jaiswal, was serving as a senior-level civil judge. On December 19, 2014, she was murdered at her residence.

The police had arrested Maninder Singh alias Mithu, Vinayak Thavra Chavan, Suraj Rambhavan Jaiswal and Surendrakumar Chamanlal Batra. According to the police, Chavan who did odd jobs for the victim was the mastermind behind the killing. During the proceedings, Batra passed away.

The trial initially began at the Alibaug sessions court, but was later transferred to the new Panvel sessions court. The final arguments concluded last week.

## ‘I am 80, I have a right to self-defence if dog attacks’

Tinnu Anand, veteran Bollywood actor-director, found himself at the centre of intense social media scrutiny after a WhatsApp message, in which he threatened to harm stray dogs near his housing society in Versova, was shared online.

The message read, “Have come back after a horrifying shoot to be greeted by terrifying dogs barking and not knowing who to bite next. Challenge taken. Have a hockey stick to face them... am warning all dog lovers hereon... take them home OR then face my wrath... my society is given advance notice.”

Subsequently, a society resident approached the Versova police station. The message soon went viral on social media, especially after animal welfare group PAL Foundation shared a screen-shot on its official Instagram account, which prompted netizens to slam the actor.

The FPJ contacted Anand to get his side of the story and this is what he said. “This is absolutely what I meant because my daughter has broken her wrist. She is being

treated for the last one month and it cost me Rs90,000 as she has undergone two surgeries till now,” he said. He continued, “Her pet dog was attacked by three stray dogs in our society and in trying to save her dog she fell and broke her wrist. I want to talk to these dog lovers. If they love these dogs then why not put a leash on them?”

Anand further said, “Ask the convenience store near the society, his delivery man has been attacked twice and now they have stopped delivery service because they don’t want to be attacked by these dogs.” Asserting that he has “every right to defend myself”, the actor said, “I am 80 years old and if any dog attacks me, I have

every right to defend myself. That is what I meant and that is what these people should have understood anyway.”

Countering the criticism against him, Anand said, “Everyone has got diuretic fingers, you know, moving towards the phones, typing away messages, which is fine with me because I’m ignoring it completely because I know what I have written. This is not the first case of dog attack. There are so many such cases.”

He concluded, saying, “It’s not to attack dogs, it’s just to defend myself and I have every right to (do that). These people are quoting the Supreme Court order. Where does the court say that you can’t defend yourself against a dog attacking you?”



## Gawlis among 7 acquitted in 2008 extortion case

The special MCOCA court on Wednesday acquitted gangster Arun Gawli, his brother Vijay Ahir and five others in a 2008 extortion case registered by a builder. Currently, Gawli is serving life imprisonment for the murder of Shiv Sena Corporator Kamlakar Jamsandekar.

Special judge BD Shelke observed that the builder’s testimony was not trustworthy as

it was riddled with “several discrepancies and contradictions”. The court found that his allegations were not supported by other witnesses or also by approvers.

As per the prosecution, the builder had taken up an SRA project in Dadar in March 2005. In October 2005, he allegedly received a call from one Raju, who asked him to visit Dagdi chawl where Gawli lived. Thereafter, Raju allegedly threatened to kill the builder if he failed to visit the



chawl. More than a month later, Raju again asked the builder to meet him, said the prosecution. It further claimed that he met Ahir, who said that the

builders around had been giving them Rs50 lakh.

However, he asked him to pay Rs25 lakh and finally settled for Rs10 lakh, said the prosecution. It was agreed that Rs7 lakh would be paid in parts and the remaining amount would be given after completion of the building. The builder claimed that he paid Rs10 lakh, but got extortion calls again in 2006 when he took up another project. The builder said that he finally approached the police in 2008

when he received a death threat.

The court noted that the builder failed to identify Ahir. It is impossible to forget a person who has made an extortion demand, reasoned the judge. The court noted that the builder was already in touch with senior police officials before the case was filed and aware that his phone was under observation. “Hence, it is highly impossible that after receipt of extortion calls, he kept mum,” the judge said.

## Headway for parking plan of Breach Candy locals

The Bhulabhai Desai Road parking plan submitted by the Breach Candy Residents Forum (BCRF) has inched closer to reality as joint commissioner of police (JCP, traffic) Anil Kumbhare ordered for site inspections and a feasibility study. On Wednesday, Breach Candy residents had a joint meeting with Kumbhare and D ward’s traffic officials, seeking approvals for their proposed parking lots. “The JCP was impressed and appreciated the ground work. He has directed the senior inspector to survey the sites proposed for the parking spaces. Once the traffic department gives nod, the BMC will be executing the plan,” said N Lakhani, a Breach Candy resident who was present at the meeting and has played a key role in preparing the plan. In its May 13th edition, the FPJ had reported about the BCRF’s plan, which was chalked after the BMC asked for an alternative following protest over its parking project.

## Case against former DCP for insulting air hostess’ modesty nixed

The Bombay High Court (HC) has quashed a case filed against retired deputy commissioner of police (DCP) Madhukar Sankhe for allegedly insulting the modesty of an air hostess.

The HC observed, “The dispute between the parties is purely personal in nature. Both of them are residing in the same society, and they are residing together peacefully as of today. No purpose will be served if the prosecution is continued.”

The FIR was registered on August 24, 2024, at the Matunga police station under section 79 of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, which deals with words or gestures intended to insult the modesty of a woman. Sankhe, who retired from the Worli headquarters in 2016, was the housing society secretary.

The incident stemmed from a disagreement in June 2024 when the society building was undergoing repainting. A signboard from a

nearby State Bank of India branch had been temporarily placed near the complainant’s parking space, obstructing her car’s movement.

On August 6, she approached Sankhe regarding the issue. According to the FIR, a quarrel ensued, during which Sankhe allegedly shouted at her. She told him he was speaking inappropriately to a woman. Following this exchange, the complainant lodged a police complaint.

However, during the court proceedings, she submitted an affidavit stating there was no longer any animosity between them.

## Man gets lifer for killing lover over wearing jeans

A sessions court has sentenced a 34-year-old man to life term for killing his girlfriend in a hotel. The court convicted him based on last seen together theory as well as the testimonies of the victim’s family and friends. According to them, Vinod Kumar suspected Sandhya Harijan’s character, used to assault her, forced her not to wear jeans and t-shirt and threatened her not to talk to other men.

As per the prosecution, the duo checked into a hotel on October 5, 2019. The manager said that as they did not leave by the specified time, he went to check. According to him, he found the woman lying motionless, while the accused was not there.

The Vakola police later found that Kumar had met with an accident and was hospitalised. He was arrested after being discharged. Public prosecutor Geeta Sharma had examined 26 witnesses, primarily to prove that the accused was last seen with the victim. Kumar claimed that when he left the hotel, Harijan was alive and that someone would have killed her in his absence. The court, however, ruled out the argument.

## 12,634-page chargesheet in ₹122cr bank scam

In the case of Rs122 crore scam at New India Co-operative Bank, the Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of the Mumbai police on Tuesday filed a chargesheet running into 12,634-pages.

It has named 16 accused, including eight arrested, two proclaimed offenders and six absconders. The EOW has also recorded 55 panchnamas

and 45 witness statements in the chargesheet.


Those named include bank’s former general manager (Accounts) Hiten Mehta, ex-CEO Abhimanyu Bhoan, Dharmesh Paun, Manohar Arunachalam and his son Ulhanath Arunachalam, Kapil Dedhia, businessman Javed Azam, Raviranjana Pandey. Former chairman Hiren Bhanu and his wife and his deputy chairman Gauri – who have been declared pro-

claimed offenders – are also among them.


The chargesheet has also named wanted accused Aiaysingh Rathod, Pawan Jaiswal, Shaukat Jamadar, chartered accountant Abhijit Deshmukh of Sanjay Rane and Associates, Laxminarayan Nayak of Shinde Nayak and Associates, and Subhash Mogal of S I Mogal and Industries. They are accused of misappropriation of deposits and loans.

The EOW had attached 21 properties worth Rs167.85 crore of five accused in the case. The probe into the scam revealed irregularities in granting several huge loans granted to ineligible borrowers. The debts were later sold to asset reconstruction companies at throw away prices causing losses to the cooperative bank.

A preliminary inquiry exposed 2,000 suspicious loans.

Several cases related to Rajput cropped up during the tenure of this government. The income tax department took cognisance of it. He had to return the land. Everyone spoke about it. But the BJP buttoned up its mouth over corruption.



## Narendra Sivaji Patel

The party remained tight-lipped over minister Narendra Sivaji Patel's conduct for not getting a table for eating in a restaurant in Gwalior. He called a team of officials of the food department at 11pm to the restaurant and asked them to raid the hotel. It was a weekly holiday, though. The minister was at fault in the incident. But he remained unscathed.

## Nagar Singh Chouhan

When another minister, Nagar Singh Chouhan, was stripped of some departments, he threatened to resign from the cabinet. Then the party was carrying out damage-control exercises. The government sent a collector to mollify the minister, but the BJP failed to act against the minister for breaching discipline.



The influence of central leadership of the party is growing over the state unit and the government.

The government and party's state unit wait for instructions from Delhi.

It is, however, well-known that the central leadership always supports the state organisation for any action it takes.

If the leaders of the state unit put up a minister's mis-

takes before the central leadership, there will be action against the person concerned. Ergo, the state unit cannot stay away from taking action on the pretext of an order from the central leadership.

The BJP has always been strong in MP. The leaders, like Anoop Mishra, Ajay Vishnoi and Jugal Kishore Bagri, were sacked from the ministry.

During his tenure as chief

minister, Babulal Gaur sacked Sunil Nayak from the cabinet.

The same foul-mouthed Vijay Shah had to resign from the ministry in 2013.

Chief Minister Mohan Yadav, party president VD Sharma and the organisational general secretary Hitanand Sharma have to act against the ministers for their faults. By doing so, they will set an example for the coming generation.

## Pushing devpt agenda, govt starts work on proposed Bhopal Metropolitan Region

The government has set the ball rolling for the development and investment plan of Bhopal Metropolitan Region. In this direction, Bhopal Commissioner Sanjeev Singh convened a meeting on Wednesday where he directed officers to prepare a plan by considering the future needs.

## Commissioner meets division Collectors, BDA & Smart City CEOs to strategise

Among those at the meeting were Bhopal Development Authority (BDA) CEO Shyambeer Singh, all Collectors of Bhopal division, Smart City CEO Anju Arun Kumar, and Joint Commissioner (Development) Vinod Yadav. BDA CEO Singh gave a presentation of the proposed project.

Meanwhile, Commissioner Singh directed all Collectors of the Bhopal division to appoint a nodal officer for the plan while coordinating with the BDA and other associated agencies. Citing the need for collating necessary data and its analysis, Singh asked all departments to ensure that their proposed projects and activities were included in the Regional Development Plan so that a comprehensive roadmap

could be prepared. The development and investment plan of Bhopal Metropolitan region will promote better managed urbanisation and will also give a new direction to employment, investment, tourism, and infrastructure.

To begin with, the state government is working on developing Bhopal and Indore Metropolitan Regions to enhance its economic infrastructure.

## 5k sqft area, 55km radius: Bhopal Metropolitan Region

An officer who attended the meeting told the Free Press on the condition of anonymity that the approximate area of Bhopal Metropolitan Region is around 9,000 square kilometres and its radius is estimated to be around 55 km. A socio-economic survey is proposed in the plan to check the migration of people from far flung areas to Bhopal. The idea would be to not overwhelm Bhopal with migratory people in search of jobs and so, employment opportunities will be planned outside Bhopal. Planning will be done to bring industries under the metropolitan concept. It will also include a tourist circuit to connect famous tourist places. As of now, suggestions are being taken from all the departments under the metropolitan plan. Shortly, a consultant will be appointed to collate all the data, the officer said.

## Temperature likely to rise in Gwalior, Chambal belt

According to the Meteorological Department, rainfall was recorded in the last 20 hours in Bhopal, Indore, Narmadapuram, and Jabalpur divisions, along with isolated pockets of Ujjain division. The weatherman has ruled out a heat wave in the state in the next four to five days.

The duty officer of the weather department said that in Western Madhya Pradesh, Ujjain recorded the highest rainfall of 49 mm and in the eastern region, Balaghat recorded the highest rainfall of 33.4 mm.

Gusty winds swept a few regions in the last 24 hours. Gusty winds with speeds of up to 61 km per hour were experienced in Sehore, while in Mandla, winds

blew at the speed of 39 km per hour. There are chances that temperature will increase by two to three notches in Gwalior, Chambal, Tikamgarh and Chattarpur.

The department has issued a thunderstorm and gusty winds warning for parts of Bhopal, Vidisha, Raisen, Sehore, Rajgarh, Narmadapuram, Betul, Harda, Burhanpur, Khandwa, Khargone, Barwani, Alirajpur, Jhabua, Guna, and Ashok Nagar districts.

Warm nights with thunderstorms are likely in parts of Rewa, Mhowganj, and Umari, while thunder activity with wind speeds ranging between 30 to 40 km/h is likely in Dhar, Indore, Dewas, Shajapur, Singrauli, Sidhi, Satna, Anuppur, Shahdol, Dindori, Katni, Jabalpur, Narsinghpur, Chhindwara, Seoni, Mandla, Balaghat, Panna, Damoh, Sagar, Mai-

## No buyers for 1000+ BMC properties worth Rs 400cr

The Bhopal Municipal Corporation (BMC) is grappling with a persistent challenge — selling over 1,000 commercial properties scattered across the city. Despite multiple attempts and auctions every 5-6 months, the properties, which include shops, plots and commercial halls, continue to remain unsold and underutilised.

As per estimates from BMC's revenue department, 1,059 properties remain unsold, with a collective market value pegged between Rs 300 and Rs 400 crore. Many of these assets are situated in key commercial zones such as Bairagarh, Nadra Bus Stand, MP Nagar, Koka Transport Nagar and New Market. Yet, encroachments and limited investor interest are proving to be major obstacles.
